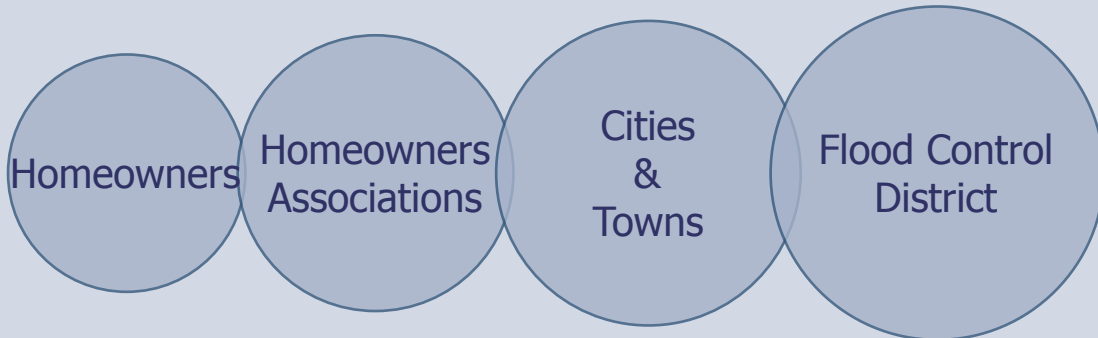




Who is Responsible for Flood Control?

EVERYONE

However assistance with flood-related issues depends on the size and location of the flood



Flood Control Responsibilities



Homeowners

- Floods controlled: Drainage on own property (backyard to front yard)
- Must adhere to HOA and city building regulations
- Ensures that changes made on property do not adversely impact neighbors



Homeowners Associations

- Floods controlled: Local facilities within the community (1-100 yr. floods)
- Maintains development built to protect community such as drainage channels and basins
- Sets and enforces community building regulations



Cities & Towns

- Floods controlled: Street-level/drainage floods within city limits (1-100 yr. floods)
- Partners with Flood Control on studies and projects
- Builds and maintains structures
- Sets and enforces building standards and reviews new development to ensure safety from 100-year floods



Flood Control District

- Floods controlled: Regional, large flood events (10-100 yr. floods)
- Large projects (dams, basins, channels)
- Partners with state, county and local government on projects
- Works with FEMA, Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies
- Adopts and enforces floodplain regulations

UNINCORPORATED
